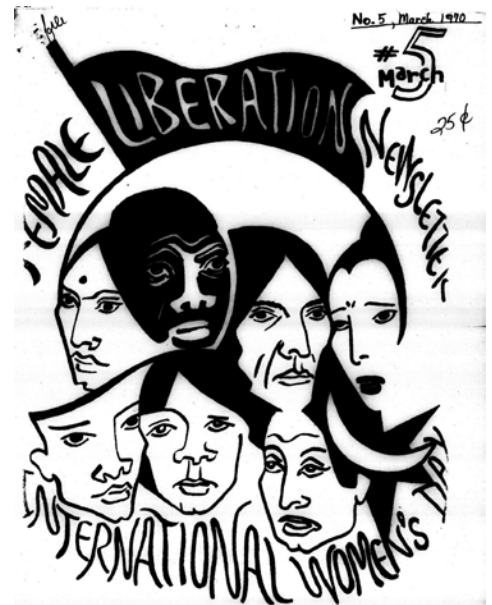

This fourth installment of the *Women's Studies Archive* program focuses on individual women and organizations around the world who blazed new paths in business, social reform, popular culture, health care, and more. Highlights for multidisciplinary study include innovative contributions of African American women; nursing journals from around the world, including Britain, Australia, Africa, Asia, and the Caribbean; popular magazines from Australia and New Zealand; and collections concerning the supernatural and crime.

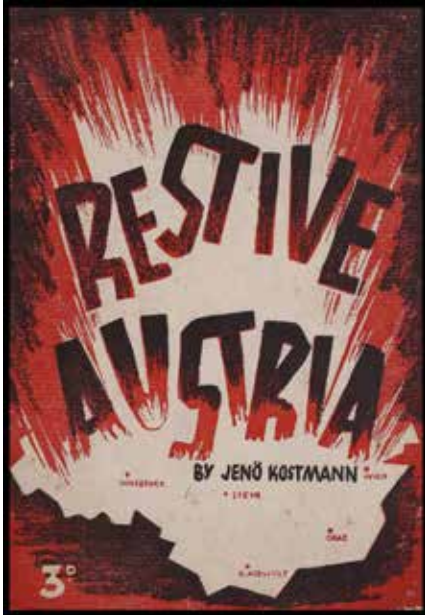


INDIGENOUS PEOPLES OF NORTH AMERICA, PART II: THE INDIAN RIGHTS ASSOCIATION, 1882–1986

The second installment of the *Indigenous Peoples of North America* series provides the near-complete papers of the first organization to address Native American interests and rights. This newly digitized collection illustrates and contextualizes the story of Indigenous peoples in the United States and Canada with unprecedented depth and breadth. As the source collection originates in the late 1800s, a portion of the correspondence is handwritten. Gale's Handwritten Text Recognition (HTR) technology enables full-text searching of the early history of the Indian Rights Association.

POLITICAL EXTREMISM AND RADICALISM, PART III: GLOBAL COMMUNIST AND SOCIALIST MOVEMENTS

The first two collections in Gale's award-winning *Political Extremism and Radicalism* series chronicle how various unorthodox political movements influenced mainstream thought and cultural norms throughout the world. *Part III* of this program examines the narratives and effects of Far Left political theories, including Marxism–Leninism, Maoism, Trotskyism, anarchism, and more. This collection hails from prestigious libraries and contains accounts that span the globe, drawing comparisons among regional communist parties and discussing why socialism succeeds in some countries but not others. The collection, covering primarily the first half of the twentieth century, offers rare, firsthand accounts of those who witnessed and participated in communist, socialist, and Far Left groups and chronicles their effects on capitalist nations. Researchers can also read about historical responses to major events.

ARCHIVES OF SEXUALITY AND GENDER: L'ENFER DE LA BIBLIOTHÈQUE NATIONALE DE FRANCE

Archives of Sexuality and Gender: L'Enfer de la Bibliothèque Nationale de France is the fifth installment of this popular and acclaimed program. It documents one of the most storied and sought-after private case collections. "L'Enfer" (hell) actually refers to the shelf mark given to the collection, but the name invokes visions of damnation and moral ruin should one delve into its scandalous volumes. It was created in the 1830s to isolate works that defied prevailing morals of the time. As with later private cases, the entire collection was kept in a locked section of the library, safeguarding it for posterity.

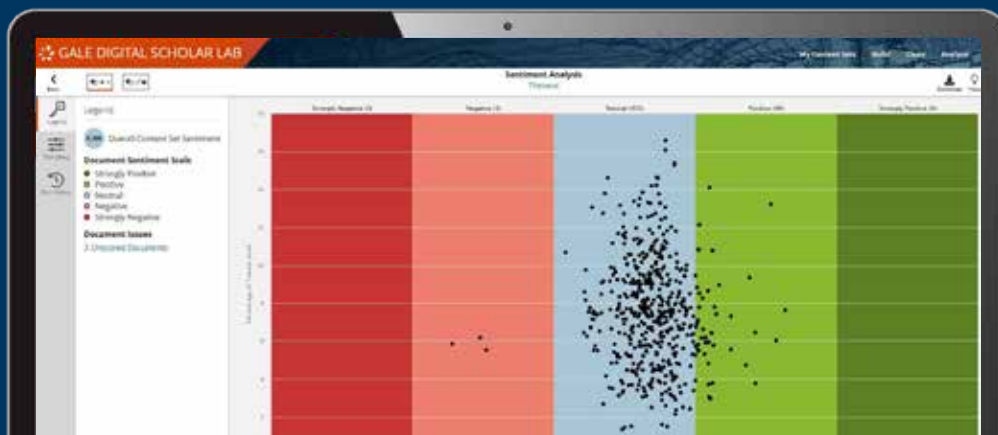

STATE PAPERS ONLINE COLONIAL: ASIA, PART I: FAR EAST, HONG KONG, AND WEI-HAI-WEI



This collection is the first installment in *State Papers Online Colonial*, which brings British Colonial Office (CO) files to a global audience for the first time. These files, currently housed in The National Archives in the United Kingdom, highlight two distinct sides of the colonial relationship: the British government and the local people who lived under its colonial rule. These documents record Britain's governance of Asian countries, as well as these countries' international relations during this period, and the changing lives of their inhabitants. CO files cover all the British colonial countries in Asia aside from India and Burma, which were territories governed from the India Office. While most documents are typescript, this is the latest *Gale Primary Sources* archive to benefit from HTR technology—fully searchable handwritten text, which allows for optical character recognition (OCR) output.



DECOLONIZATION: POLITICS AND INDEPENDENCE IN FORMER COLONIAL AND COMMONWEALTH TERRITORIES

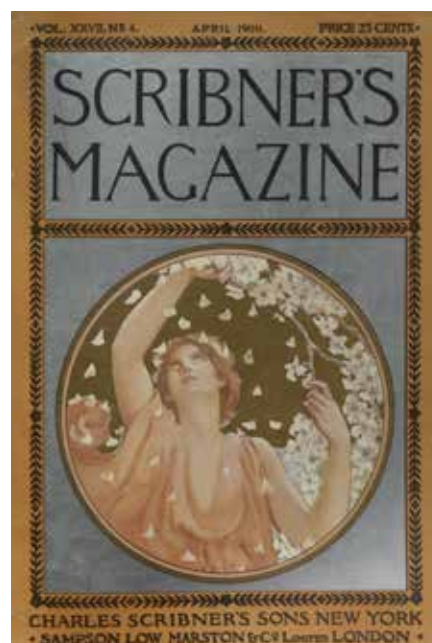
This brand-new archive presents political ephemera and organizational material produced during the twentieth century in over 70 previously colonized countries. Researchers can access primary sources, which are crucial to understanding the processes and movements of colonization. The collection also sheds light on national political developments that followed decolonization and how former colonies negotiated their own agency and futures. Users can draw comparisons between different political movements within newly independent countries, discovering how and why self-rule developed differently in each region. The archive provides an opportunity for less Eurocentric readings of decolonization through access to non-Western primary source materials produced by, for, and about the peoples of represented countries. Consequently, the archive provides unparalleled insight into the range of political movements and the individuals who rose to power in these new systems.

AMERICAN HISTORICAL PERIODICALS FROM THE AMERICAN ANTIQUARIAN SOCIETY, PART VII

The seventh collection of newly digitized holdings from the American Antiquarian Society features periodicals covering a wide variety of topics, including art, commerce, education, health and medicine, literature, regional and national history, military history, politics, religion, women's suffrage, and young people. The broad scope of these rare publications, which includes the first-ever collection of large-format magazines, gives researchers multiple lenses through which to view the American experience.

BRITISH LIBRARY NEWSPAPERS: PART VI: IRELAND, 1783–1950

With the unequalled variety of national and regional Irish newspapers that can be found in *British Library Newspapers, Part VI*, researchers will discover valuable narratives to counter those established by the English news media. Such stories cover diverse topics that are core to the Irish identity: independence, the Irish diaspora, the Roman Catholic Church, famines, and much more.

TIMES EDUCATIONAL SUPPLEMENT HISTORICAL ARCHIVE, 1910–2000

Student and faculty researchers can find nine decades of insight from the world's longest-running print authority on education, *Times Educational Supplement* (TES). The nearly 4,400 supplement issues contain more than articles on education in the UK. TES resources include a repository of relevant opinions, reviews, and reports of matters extending beyond pedagogy to encompass educational reform, social policy, and the effects of Anglo-American education on local cultures in other countries, and much more.

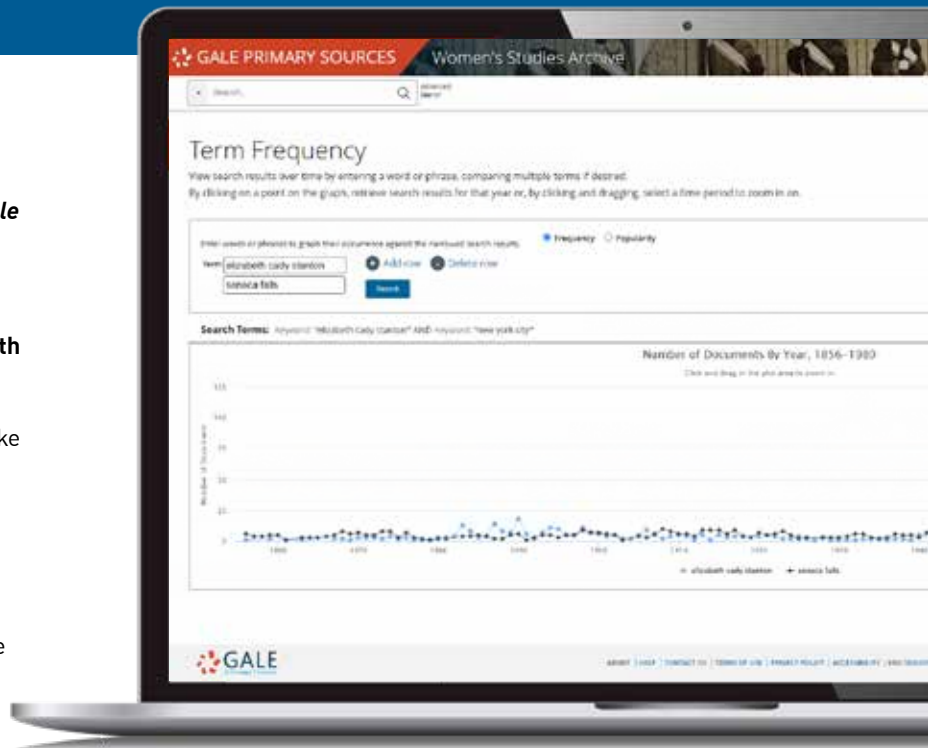
